What does homework look like in Year 4?

- Project Homework for Literacy (30 mins) Set at beginning of term with one task to be completed per week: out on a Thursday, due in by the following Wednesday
- Spellings homework (30 mins) Set on Friday, due in the following Wednesday.



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Reading

- Please encourage your children to read at home every day. They should read independently and to an adult. Discussing the text is a great way to check they are understanding their reading. Please encourage them to read a range of different books, written by different authors, both fiction and non-fiction. It would be useful if you could note the pages read in your child's home learning diary.
- Reading books should be taken to and from school daily and the Home Learning Diary should be signed every week.



Assessment and Marking

Lessons have a learning objective which is written at the top of a piece of work. When the work is marked, we use:

Tickled Pink to show when the learning objective has been achieved

Green for Growth to show an area that needs further development. This is often followed by a comment which helps the pupil to improve their work.

After each piece of work, the pupils self-assess their understanding. They place a 'traffic light' colour after the learning objective: green for 'understood' amber for 'almost got it' red for 'help! I found this difficult!'

There will also be evidence of peer assessment when the children assess each other's work. They work to a set of agreed criteria and produce **Tickled Pink** and **Green for Growth** comments too.

Formal assessments take place regularly and results and any interventions required are discussed as a team.
