Talk4writing

Just before the start of term, the teaching staff undertook training in Talk4writing techniques. Proven to raise attainment, this is powerful approach because it enables children to imitate the language they need for a particular topic orally before reading and analysing it, and then writing their own version. Paired Reading

On Friday, we launched a new paired reading scheme with pupils from Year 6 working alongside those from Year 4, and children from Year 5 working with Year 3. Evidence has shown that this approach can significantly improve the reading skills of both pupils in each partnership, as it develops key concepts of fluency and comprehension, enabling children to use discussion to learn, elaborate and explain about what they have read.

Although very early days, initial signs for both of these new methods have been very positive, with children and staff highly engaged and enjoying these fresh approaches to developing key literacy skills.
