
Pupils enter and exit the site via the Murray Road gate. This open from 8.30am -8.50am (the start of the school day) and again from 3.15pm - 3.45pm.

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Curriculum Information Evening – Tuesday 17th September



Each teaching team is looking forward to our upcoming Curriculum Information Evening on 17th September, where they will make a short presentation as to what your child will be studying this term, as well as share some general information about housekeeping matters. Each year group team will deliver a short presentation and answer 'housekeeping' questions at 6.00pm, repeating the **same** session again at 6.30pm. You do not need to book a place, just attend at the time that suits you. Parking will be available on the playground from 5.45pm. Please note, entrance to school will be via the playground as the main office closes at 5.00pm.

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Punctuality

Despite being back for only eight days, there are already a number of children who have been late for school several times.

It is important that pupils arrive on time for a number of reasons.

- It is stressful to arrive late and flustered, and it can feel very awkward walking into the classroom after a lesson has begun;
- Interruptions disrupt the learning of classmates and the flow of the lesson;
- Children who arrive in good time are able to spend time with friends and have a calm, well-ordered start to the day;
- Arriving late can mean missing key information about the day's activities;

It is the legal responsibility of parents to ensure that their child is in school on time and a few minutes lost here and there soon adds up.

5 minutes late each day	3 days lost
10 minutes late each day	6.5 days lost
15 minutes late each day	10 days lost
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost

Days are school days and calculated over a school year

St Paul's has been selected to take part in the Greenredeem School Donation Scheme along with 14 other Wokingham schools. 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Forest Schools at St Paul's



This concept originated in Scandinavia and was introduced into Britain in 1993 were inspired by how pre-school children developed their skills in an outdoor, woodland environment and, upon their return, began to develop what is now known as Forest Schools. This approach has now been successfully adopted by thousands of school all over the country, including St Paul's.

Forest Schools is about taking the curriculum outdoors, allowing pupils the freedom to use their imagination and creativity in ways they may have not done so before. Proven to enhance the learning of children of all ages, this approach develops self-confidence, self-awareness and self-control, thus enriching and enhancing learning for every participant.

With 384 pupils, the woodland area will not sustain

every child participating in a weekly visit without damage to the eco system and therefore the plan involves all pupils on a rolling basis. Our aim is that by the time the children leave St Paul's, they will have each spent time down in our Forest School.

Here are just a few of the things the children have said:

- "I absolutely love learning this way."
- "I have done things that I didn't think I could."
- "It's my best lesson all week because I'm learning and having fun at the same time."
- "I've learnt so much about the world just from being outside in the woods."

Feedback from parents has been equally positive: "My child was one of the first to try this out and it had great results, not only learning and widening his life experiences, but with further results transferring back into the class room too. It has also boosted his confidence no end!"

"My daughter comes running out of school with a huge grin on her face and talks non-stop about her sessions. She is often still talking about it at bedtime."



"One of my children has had the chance to participate and I am delighted that the other will also have a turn too. What a great opportunity to be able to offer all of the pupils."



During sessions, pupils experience a varied range of projects, such as: Bush craft; crafts; den building; observing wildlife; and problem solving, to name just a few. Sessions close with a few minutes reflection time.


