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### **Headteacher's Message**

Dear St Paul's Families,

Welcome back!

On Monday, the staff were very excited about the return of the children and quite right too! We have had four fabulous days with them and an excellent start to the term.

It is wonderful to be welcoming so many new pupils to our school family and all of our newest recruits look as if they have been here for years! Now they are into the swing of things and know where to meet their teachers on the playground, today is the last day that we will make use of the bus stops for Year 3. From Monday, to ease congestion, we ask that all parents 'kiss and go', dropping children off at the gate.

The safety of our pupils is paramount and so, when picking up at the end of the day, please enter the site to the left of the cones and then turn left after the wooden gate and walk along the end of the playground, behind the barriers and along the far side of the playground. This will enable the teachers to line classes up safely, ready for collection, without adults walking through the middle of children being led out to line up. It gives clear sight lines for staff to monitor the children in their care.

Earlier this week, I wrote to you regarding RAAC. Our school was surveyed at 7.45am yesterday and I am very pleased to be able to advise that there was no evidence of this type of concrete found in the main building or in the Learning Lodge.

Along with this Newsletter is an Online Safety, Parental Controls Booklet to assist you in helping your child navigate their digital world safely.

The amber weather alert continues into the weekend and so it promises to continue to be very hot and sticky. Whatever you get up to, have a lovely time!

#### **PE and Swimming**

Swimming Lessons commence next week. Pupils should come to school dressed in uniform, including school shoes, and bring their kit (costume or trunks, towel and

swimming hat) to change into at the pool. We ask that swimming trunks are close fitting and not long, baggy Bermuda style shorts and that girls wear a one piece suit. Swimming hats can be purchased from school.

The PE timetable will be sent out when swimming finishes. This is usually at October half term, weather permitting.

#### **Outdoor Games**

All classes will have outdoor Games on Thursday. **Pupils should come to school dressed in PE kit.** (navy or black shorts or tracksuit, plain white t-shirt). Games lessons take place every week in all but the most extreme weather and, therefore, we ask that pupils bring their uniform too, in case they have to change into dry clothes.

## **Nut Free and Healthy School**



St Paul's is a **nut free school** and as a number of our pupils have severe nut allergies, please ensure that your child does not bring any food item into school which contains nuts. If you are unsure, please check the ingredients or leave it to be enjoyed at home – thank you.

As a school, St Pauls has healthy school status. We teach the children about the importance of healthy diet and exercise. We understand that pupils like to celebrate their birthday with their classmates. However, we do not permit them to hand out birthday sweets or cake. This is for a number of reasons, including the fact that we cannot guarantee that these treats will not contain ingredients that could make another child unwell. It is not because we don't want our children to have fun. It is to ensure that we keep them safe. Thank you for your understanding.

## **Dropping off Items**

Please don't not worry if your child forgets their water bottle packed lunch or pencil case we can provide them with the things they require for the day that they may have forgotten. We do not call home for any forgotten PE or swimming kits and if we have any available kit we will offer it to your child.

#### Clubs

Information about clubs will be sent out to all parents via Parentmail this evening, Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September at 8.00pm. The limit is two clubs per child to ensure that as many pupils as possible are able to participate in extracurricular activities.

## **Absence and Updating details**

If your child is unwell, we need a written record from you of why they are not at school for our register. Absences should be reported via the absence section under Parent Mail, or by emailing <a href="mailto:absence@stpauls.wokingham.sch.uk">absence@stpauls.wokingham.sch.uk</a>, detailing name, class and the reason that your child is unable to come to school that day.

If you need to update your personal details please do this by using the SIMS Parent APP. If this is not possible please email the admin team.

#### **School Lunches**

The new price of a Caterlink school lunch is £2.53. Caterlink operate a cashless system and for your child to have a school lunch, their SCOPAY account must be in credit.

## **Open Morning – Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October**

We will be holding our open event on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October, giving you an opportunity to see our school during a normal working day.

School will be open from 9.00am to 9.55am and should you wish to drop in during these times, please sign in at the Oxford Road entrance, where you will be issued with a visitor's badge. We make no changes to the timetable and lessons run as normal for this event to give you a feel of what learning is like at St Paul's. If you are unable to visit on the 5<sup>th</sup>, we will be holding further open events throughout the year.

## **Curriculum Information Evening – Wednesday 13th September 2024**

Each teaching team will give a short presentation on the curriculum and talk about ways in which we can work together to ensure the best possible outcomes for your child this year. They will also briefly touch on 'housekeeping' matters such as homework etc. Each year group will deliver the same presentation twice (5:00pm & 5:45pm) so parents with children in different year groups have the opportunity to attend. For this event, please enter school via the Murray Road entrance as the office will be closed. There will be staff at the doors waiting to direct you to where the presentations will take place.

Parents' Consultations will be face to face meetings and you will have the opportunity to look through books and visit classrooms. Meetings with teachers will take place in the main hall.

Booking will open on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September and close on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October. Instructions of how to make an appointment will be sent out the week before, via ParentMail.
