Access to the school site

The car park is extremely congested with cars often double parking and pedestrians having to weave in and out of moving vehicles. To ensure the safety of pupils, parents and staff, from half term onwards, there will be NO vehicular access for parents to the school site between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30 pm. Should you need to drop off /pick up from school during these times, please park in the spaces in the mouth of the gates. If the spaces are full, you will need to park away from school. No cars should be left in front of either the double gates to the drive of St Paul's or those into Walter car park. This is the access for emergency vehicles.

If the gates are open to let staff enter or leave, please do not tailgate and drive into the car park as you will be asked to leave your car on site until 4.30pm, when all clubs and the associated pupils and parents have safely left the site.

To enter the site, press the buzzer on the panel at the pedestrian gate.



General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

As you will undoubtedly be aware there are new regulations concerning Data Protection coming into force from the end of May. GDPR is an update to the current Data Protection Act 1998. In practice, our data handling systems will change very little as we already treat information regarding our pupils and families with the utmost care. We recognise the sensitive nature of the information we hold, only sharing data where there is a legal requirement for us to do so, or where we have obtained the necessary consent.

GDPR requires us to update Privacy Notices for pupils, parents, staff, governors and volunteers and we have also reviewed and updated our Data Protection Policy to reflect the new regulations. All of this information is available on our website here. Although we do very little marketing for companies that offer products we think will be of interest to parents, we will no longer be providing this type of information. As the PTA are a separate entity to the school, they will provide their own privacy notice.
