## Review of Year 5's Trip to Winchester Science Centre



Thank you to Riley and Oliva (5M) for writing this fantastic report about their trip to Winchester Science Centre last week.

*On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May, Year 5 boarded the coaches bound for the Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium.*

### Activity 1. Planetarium.

In the Planetarium, we explored the different constellations and took a closer look at the planets and moons. It was as if we were flying through space. We also learnt there are a variety of galaxies not just ours.

### Activity 2. Workshop.

In the Discover Space Workshop, we witnessed refracted white light- that we could see with special glasses- which showed a dazzling circle of rainbow light (a rainbow spectrum). There was an infra-red light that gave off heat. Using this knowledge, the year 5 pupils looked at different materials and how we absorb or reflect heat. The final thing we looked at in this Workshop is how light can reflect off of mirrors to change its direction.

### Activity 3. Explore Space and Science exhibit.

In the final activity, many of us got to experience what it was like in a spacesuit. We got to test how heavy things are in space and played in the little big room. We were also able to create sound waves with a massive guitar, launch rockets and create bubbles in different liquids.

## Swimming and Games

On their swimming days, pupils should come to school dressed in uniform, including school shoes, and bring their kit (costume or trunks, towel and swimming hat) to change into at the pool. We ask that swimming trunks are close fitting and not long, baggy Bermuda style shorts and that girls wear a one-piece suit.

**If you have not yet had an opportunity to contribute £12.50 towards the running of the pool, we would be very grateful if you could make a payment via Scopay.**

Swimming hats can be purchased from school for £2.50 – payable on Scopay

**Please remember that earrings are not permitted during any sport sessions and must be removed AT HOME before attending school that day.**

### Outdoor Games

All classes have Games each Thursday. Pupils should come to school dressed in PE kit (navy or black shorts or tracksuit, plain white t-shirt). No football shirts or brightly coloured sports kit!

## Forest School



We welcomed 5M into the woodland on Monday afternoon. The children worked enthusiastically, collaboratively and with determination as they made a class flag, using the Japanese art of Hapa Zome. Their flag was proudly displayed today in their class assembly.

Our afternoon groups took part in a blindfold activity which developed their communication and collaboration skills. Many spoke about how they could trust their partner as they had been given clear instructions, which had made them feel safe.



The children have also been tending to the allotment and have been delighted to see pea pods growing, plenty of strawberries waiting to ripen and the start of some foliage peeking through the ground from our potatoes.

Please remember to send your child to Forest School in **long trousers** as the nettles are out! Pupils will need to bring suitable clothing with them on that day e.g. track suit bottoms, hoodie, T shirt and trainers. Shorts and skirts are unsuitable for the woodland area.

### Free School Meals/Pupil Premium

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this helps us to provide curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children. Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one of the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit - Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
