

Forest School News

Over the past two weeks, we have experienced a variety of weather but none of it has stopped the children learning at Forest School.

Peer teaching has been evident as the children have learned how to light cotton wool pads using the flint and steels, with great success. In our next sessions, the aim will be to light a fire to cook on.

Our latest piece of equipment in the woodland is a slackline which is extremely popular. Slacklines have been proven to enhance focus, concentration, memory and learning, as well as increasing core and lower body strength.

We have been lucky enough to receive a donation of 30 saplings from the Woodland Trust which has kept the children busy this week. We have been given dogrose, hawthorn, hazel, dogwood and willow saplings to create a hedgerow which the children have carefully planted along our boundary fence. We look forward to nurturing these saplings and watching them grow over the coming years.

The children are loving their learning and we've chosen just a small sample of their work to share in this week's Newsletter.



















Reporting an absence

If your child is unwell, we need a written record from you of why they are not at school for our register. Absences should be reported via the absence section under ParentMail, or by emailing absence@stpauls.wokingham.sch.uk, detailing name, class and the reason that your child is unable to come to school that day. Please do not worry about phoning school as well – the written record of why your child is absent is what we really need.

HAF Programme – Christmas Bookings Now Open

The Christmas HAF Programme is now live! The programme is open to any families who are receiving benefits related free school meals (FSMs) and helps to fill the gap for those children during some of the main school holidays (Christmas/Easter/Summer) by providing funded activities and a healthy meal. This is separate from universal free school meals which is for all children from Reception to year 2 and is also separate from pupil premium. Parents must have applied and been accepted for FSMs through their child's school in order to automatically qualify for the HAF programme.

To participate in the programme, parents need a unique WBC booking code. If you do not yet have a code, you can request one by completing a form online at:

If you already have a code, but do not remember it, email: HAF@wokingham.gov.uk

The Christmas programme will consist of:

- Funded holiday clubs for primary aged children (2 days of 6 hours per day)
- Funded supervised activities for secondary aged young people
- Funded holiday club with Reading Football Community Trust or family Stay and Play sessions at Building for the Future for children with SEND
- HAF Christmas Event a session to attend as a family consisting of activities, crafts, a panto, food and an appearance by Father Christmas, two dates with one date for children with SEND

Funding is limited and therefore not guaranteed. The priority is for those families who are not able to afford any activities for their children during the holidays and where a child/children are identified as vulnerable/in need. Please include as much information as possible on the reason for referral to support the application.

Help with cost-of-living crisis

More people than are relying on credit cards, asking families members for help, missing meals and their overdrafts to get by. You can go to them for help. Here's how:

Funding for families, food and energy

Almost 2,000 young people who receive means-tested free school meals have had help through the <u>Household Support Fund</u> already.

If your child gets means-tested free school meals apply for the Household Support Fund through First Days Children's Charity

If your child does not receive means-tested free school meals we have another grant you can apply for if you are struggling.

If you're struggling with bills or buying food apply for the Household Support Fund through Age UK Berkshire or Citizens Advice

Please note you are only able to apply for one grant type from the Household Support Fund.

Other support options:

Go to the cost of living help hub for help and tips open to all

Go to the help for families with cost of living advice pages

See how you can get help with household bills

Register for priority services if you have children aged five or under, you are pregnant or if you or a family member is disabled or has a long term health condition

See services you can contact directly for help with essentials like food or warm clothes

If you'd prefer to talk to someone, contact One Front Door. This is a service led by Citizens Advice which helps residents find the most appropriate support. Use the online referral form or call 0808 278 7958, Monday to Friday.


