## Safeguarding – reporting online safety concerns

When in school, pupils are unable to access the online world without the supervision of a trained adult and we also have effective filtering and monitoring in place as part of our safeguarding arrangements. When your child is online at home, should you feel concerned with anything you or your child has seen or has been asked to do by someone in the digital world, the following sites provide advice and guidance of the steps you can take to keep them safe.



<u>CEOP – the Child Exploitation and Online Protection</u> are there for support if you are worried about online sexual abuse or the way someone has been communicating with you online.



The <u>NSPCC</u> is a UK leading children's charity, preventing abuse and helping those affected to recover.



<u>Childline</u> is a counselling service for children and young people up to their 19th birthday.



<u>Internet Matters</u> provide a series of age-specific online safety checklists including how to set parental controls on a range of devices and making search engines safe.



The <u>Internet Watch Foundation</u> – you can anonymously and confidentially report child sexual abuse content and images posted online.

When reporting an absence please ensure you have sent in your absence either by email or ParentMail by 8.45am. Please include your child's full name and class and when stating the reason for the absence, "unwell" or "under the weather" are not suitable reasons and will not be acceptable. Please give symptoms or explanation as to why they are absent from school.

## **Message from the Governors**



There are 3 vacancies on the governing body of our school for Parent Governors. The governing body is made up of people from different groups including parents, teachers, local authority appointed members and foundation governors who are appointed by the

diocese. A term of office lasts for 4 years – you will be amazed at how quickly the time flies. Depending on interests and

expertise each governor sits on at least one of the three committees: Learning & Teaching, Health & Safety and Finance & Personnel. Our current governors have introduced themselves on the governor page of the school web site.

#### What do governors do?

School governors:

- are responsible for the strategic management of the school;
- oversee its aims, values and ethos;
- promote high standards of educational attainment;
- monitor pupil progress and attainment;
- ensure compliance with the National Curriculum;
- manage the budget, including deciding the number of staff and pay;
- participate in the appointment of the Headteacher and Deputy Head;
- regulate school conduct and discipline.

The governors act as a team, but the amount of time that each is able to give to the role varies. The full governing body meets every half term and committees between 3 and 6 times a year. The governors support the school in practical ways throughout the year by joining in with events. Once a term they are invited in to spend a whole day in school observing how their discussions and decisions are being put into practice. The highlight of these days is always talking to the pupils in their classrooms, over lunch and in the playground.

#### What will I get out of being a governor?

You will get:

- the knowledge that you have played a significant part in improving children's education and supporting the staff;
- a chance for continuing professional development and to develop new skills, such as chairing meetings, asking questions, making suggestions and monitoring the budget;
- A chance to work as part of a dynamic team.

### Get help with the cost of living

The Household Support Fund can help you pay for food, energy, bills and other essentials. It's open to:

- Families where <u>children receive means-tested free school meals can get £20 per week</u> during the school holidays until Easter 2024
- Anyone struggling to pay bills or buy food can apply for £240 or £120 depending on the size of their household

### If you've already applied for the Household Support Fund you do not need to apply again.

Other cost of living help options

There's a range of help and support options you can use to help you this winter:

- Check the <u>cost of living help hub</u>, including our guides
  - o Help for people with children
  - o Help for single people
  - o Help for pensioners
  - o Help if you're in an emergency
- SHARE Wokingham offers fresh produce, like bread and vegetables, for those who need it. These are surplus stock from local supermarkets. More than 2,000 people use it each week and it has saved more than 1,000 tonnes in food waste since it was launched a few years ago. View the food map to see SHARE's 15 locations and find your nearest.
- Follow these top tips for households on how to lower your energy bills this winter. Or you can try:
  - o The council's new home energy advice service to see how to lower your bills
  - o See if you're eligible <u>Great British Insulation Scheme</u> is offering free or cheaper insulation to reduce your home's energy bills
  - Check if your home is eligible for a Heat Pump Grant a part of the Boiler Upgrade Scheme up to £7,500 on offer towards the costs
- We're encouraging people to <u>register with power, water and gas suppliers</u> if they are potentially vulnerable this winter.
   These are known as priority services, which mean you get help faster if you are cut off or additional warnings if there are outages like loss of water pressure or power cuts
- The <u>Winter Warmers scheme</u> can help you get free items, if you're struggling with the cost of living. This includes things like air fryers, slow cookers, heated airers and more. These will lower your energy usage and bills
- Contact Citizens Advice, Wokingham, to find the most appropriate support for your situation. Use the <u>online referral form</u> or call <u>0808 278 7958</u>, Monday to Friday.

#### HAF

As a reminder, the HAF Programme offers funding for activities in the main school holidays of Easter, summer and Christmas for children and young people in school years from Reception to year 11 who are eligible to benefits related free school meals. There is also the option for professionals working with families, who are not eligible but would benefit from the programme, to make a referral depending on their family circumstances. You can find full details on our website: Holiday, activities, and food programme (wokingham.gov.uk)

In Wokingham, the entitlement for primary aged children is:

- X2 6 hour days per week for 1 week at Easter, 1 week at Christmas and x4 weeks in the summer. HAF does not operate in half term holidays.
- The HAF Team also run events across the Borough during school holidays for families to attend together. Along with our regular twice weekly SEND stay and play sessions and our newly launched SEND drop off sessions for children and young people aged 8-13 years.

Although children in years Reception to Year 2 ALL receive Universal free school meals, in order to identify those families who are eligible for the HAF Programme we encourage parents to apply for benefits related free school meals as early as possible.

All allocations for funding and vouchers for parents to be able to book funded activities will continue to be via the new Wonde (e-Vouchers) booking system. If parents have any queries about receiving their vouchers, they can contact <a href="https://hatch.com/hatch

#### **Pupil Premium Funding**

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits your child may be eligible for free school meals and Pupil Premium funding:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
