## St Paul's C of E Junior School

#### Dear Parents

Drop off and pick up is now working well and lots of you have mentioned that the process is speedier than ever. Thank you for your ongoing support and for doing all that you can to ensure you remain 2 metres away from other parents. We will continue to ask you to wait on the field as this keeps the pavements clear and pedestrian traffic free flowing, all of which will helps keep parents, children and staff of St Paul's, Walter and Meadow as safe as possible.

We appreciate what a highly anxious time this is for parents but please be assured that should we have the slightest concern regarding a child's health - pandemic or not - we contact parents immediately. With regards to the current situation, our staff are highly vigilant and understand what to look out for. If there is a child who exhibits a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste, we immediately isolate them and request they be collected from school, along with any siblings. If there are younger or preschool siblings attending Walter, we notify them too. In this event, they would not be permitted to return until the family had self-isolated for the required period or have received negative Covid-19 test results.

There are currently no pupils or staff in school who have Covid-19 symptoms but there are a number who have heavy colds. According to the latest government guidance, people suffering from colds are not being tested unless they have additional Covid symptoms. Attendance at school is mandatory and we are not permitted by the educational welfare service to refuse attendance to someone suffering from a common cold.

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# INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & CARERS

Everyone has a role to play in keeping our schools safe and helping to stop the spread of COVID-19.

## YOU SHOULD BOOK A COVID-19 TEST IF YOUR CHILD HAS:

#### A HIGH TEMPERATURE

#### A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH

This means they feel hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure their temperature).

OR

YOUR CHILD

WHAT TO DO?

TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

- Inform school immediately

as advised by the PHA.

- Self-isolate for at least 10 days

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school

after 10 days even if they still

or taste. These symptoms can

have a cough / loss of smell

last for several weeks.

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL

This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).

DON'T SEND YOUR CHILD **TO SCHOOL IF THEY HAVE COVID-19 SYMPTOMS.** 

VISIT NIDIRECT.GOV.UK/ **CORONAVIRUS TO BOOK A TEST ONLINE. CALL 119 IF YOU CANNOT BOOK A TEST ONLINE.** 

#### A LOSS OR CHANGE TO THEIR SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE

This means they've noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT HAVE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 BUT HAS OTHER COLD-LIKE SYMPTOMS, SUCH AS A RUNNY NOSE, THEY DO NOT NEED TO BE TESTED AND THEY OR MEMBERS OF YOUR HOUSEHOLD DO NOT NEED TO SELF-ISOLATE. YOUR CHILD CAN ATTEND SCHOOL IF FIT TO DO SO.

### HERE'S WHAT TO DO IF:

#### **YOUR CHILD** HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

#### WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL
- Book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform school immediately about test result

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school if the test is negative providing they are well enough, have not had a fever for 48 hours and if they haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

#### CONTACT TRACING HAS IDENTIFIED MY CHILD AS A CLOSE CONTACT

#### WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL - Self-isolate for at least 14 days as advised by the PHA Contact **Tracing Service** 

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when they have completed 14 days of selfisolation without any symptoms\*.

## WHAT TO DO? - Attend school as normal

## SOMEBODY IN MY HOUSEHOLD HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

OR

#### WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL - The household member should
- book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform school immediately about test result

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school if the symptomatic household member's test is negative and if they haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA **Contact Tracing Service.** 

## TRAVELLED ABROAD

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL - Self-isolate for 14 days in line with guarantine advice

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when they have completed 14 days of selfisolation without any symptoms\*.



#### SOMEBODY IN MY HOUSEHOLD TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL - Inform school immediately
  - about test result

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when they have completed 14 days of selfisolation without any symptoms\*.

\*If your child has been identified as a close contact of a case of COVID-19, or has returned from travel abroad and is self-isolating, they must self-isolate for 14 days regardless of a negative COVID-19 test result.
