The session will be led by Katie Skinner, teacher and child wellbeing specialist who is experienced in supporting pupils with communication, interaction, social or emotional difficulties and helping them to develop appropriate emotional regulation skills.

During the session, there will be lots of time for questions and should you have any specific areas or concerns you would like Katie to address, please let us know in advance and we will pass them on.

Punctuality – Why Should I Arrive for School on Time

An increasing number of children are arriving late for school each day. It is important that pupils arrive on time for a number of reasons:



- It is the legal responsibility of parents to ensure their child is in school on time;
- Children who are punctual have a calm, well-ordered start to the school day;
- Arriving late means children miss work and key information about the day's activities;
- Late arrivals disrupt the learning of their classmates;
- It is stressful to arrive late and flustered, and can feel very awkward to arrive after a lesson has begun.

## **Forest School News**

We enjoyed the company of 3B in the woods on the Monday before half term. They practised the Japanese art of Hapa Zome (leaf-dying) and our Forest School fence is now adorned with their amazing bunting. Our focus with the afternoon groups was centred around bees, as Friday was World Bee Day. After playing a bee themed game, we shared bee facts – did you know that a bee can fly at 25km per hour? The children then used bamboo (harvested from Mr Walsh's garden) to create bee homes to hang in our Forest School area.

We have also spent time in the allotment, weeding, harvesting and tasting our broad beans, before planting out courgettes, peas, carrots and sunflowers – all grown from seed by the children.

The children have practised their teamwork, resilience and communication skills and we are so proud of them all.





This week has seen lots of new skills taught in the woodland, many of these have involved peer teaching: fires have been lit with the flint and steels and clove hitches and square lashings have been tied to create picture frames and dreamcatchers. The children have been resilient and encouraging towards others while learning these new skills. During our reflective time, the children spoke about things that they have noticed or felt. Some noticed that the fox hole in our woods is looking bigger, that the strawberries in our allotment have grown over half term, while others felt proud of the new skills that they had learned.
