Wow what a year we have had! We have had 150 children representing the school in a variety of different events such as TVRL cross country, Boccia, badminton, football, netball, athletics, cricket, gymnastics, hockey, New Age Kurling, tennis and orienteering. We have taken part in competitions specifically for children who have little or no experience of those sports. These competitions are designed to increase participation and awareness of the variety of sports available.

We have competed in girls' and boys' football, netball and cricket leagues placing either first or second in each competition. We have had 77 children running at least one race over the TVRL season and finished up silver medalists in Girls Y5/6 Relay, as well as Marnie Fieldsend taking Gold for the season.
