As soon as the government issue schools with written guidance, we will let you know and when preparations for the children's return are underway, we will keep you abreast of our plans as they unfold.

We are very thankful that our school community has not been hit as hard by the virus as some others. From the information shared with us, it seems that the vast majority of pupils and parents that have been affected are now safely on the road to recovery.
