Reading

Cover your new Reading Journal - you could use wrapping paper or sticky back plastic. Write your name and class neatly on the front. Read aloud to an adult for 20 minutes at least 4 times every week. During your reading, make sure you have answered at least 3 questions from different sections of the [Reading Booklet for Parents](#). Then, discuss how you feel about what you have read. Ask the adult to write a comment in your Reading Journal.

Spelling

Remember the first week is learning and the second week is consolidation. Explain what a homophone is to an adult. The homophones that we will be focusing on are:

- their, there and they're
- to, two and too
- which and witch
- write and right

Discuss these words and different ways to remember them, Make a list of any homophones that you find in your reading. Remember to take your list into school on Friday. The Statutory Spelling List can be found [here](#)

Word of the Day

Share your class's word of the day with your family. Explain what it means and try to impress them by using it appropriately in conversation. Challenge them to find synonyms (words with a similar meaning).
