This is the first time St Paul's have participated in the competition and none of the children knew what to expect. They played lots of games against 7 other schools. The red team did very well coming in 2nd place – well done. Our blue team unfortunately did not have the full requirement of players, so were unable to score, however we had lots of fun competing against the other schools.

QuadKids

A mixed team of 5 boys and 5 girls took part in a Quadkids competition at Palmer Park last Monday. The weather was cold and rainy but that didn't stop all the children having a fantastic time representing the school. All the athletes had to run a 75m sprint and a 600m race as well as throwing a vortex howler and completing a standing long jump. There were 24 schools competing over two sessions one in the morning and the other in the afternoon session. Therefore we had to wait a couple of days to find out the results. St Paul's continues to dominate in the School Games athletics competitions with a strong performance and bringing back silver medals. They have therefore, qualified as the Wokingham representatives for the Berkshire School Games Finals at the end of the month. Congratulations to all the children who took part!

Space Chase 2019 Summer Reading Challenge – Wokingham Borough Libraries

Organised by charity The Reading Agency (www.readingagency.org.uk) and the UK public library network the Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest annual reading promotion for children aged 4 to 11. Last year, in Wokingham Borough, 3000 children took part.

The Summer Reading Challenge combines FREE access to books with fun, creative activities in the library during the summer holidays. Throughout the Challenge, library staff and young volunteers support the children, helping them to discover new authors and illustrators and to explore a wide range of different types of books and ways of reading,

How the Challenge works

- Children sign up at their local library and receive a Space Chase collector folder on their return visit
- Children borrow and read at least six library books of their own choice during the summer, collecting special stickers to complete their folder and incentives along the way
- Library staff and young volunteers are on hand to advise and run family-friendly activities
- Children who complete the Summer Reading Challenge are presented with a certificate and a medal

Please identify your needs on the application form ahead of the course so we can work with you to prepare any support you may need. You can also discuss any needs with your tutor on the first session.
