

Latest guidance and information for Schools re: Living with Covid-19

OUR PLAN FOR LIVING WITH COVID

The guidance for health protection in schools and other childcare settings has been updated. The link with further information on this guidance and Living safely with respiratory infections, including COVID-19 can be found below.

The main summary for public health management of specific infectious diseases for respiratory infections including COVID-19 (Chapter 3 of guidance) are:

- Symptoms include runny nose, high temperature, cough and sore throat.
- For most children these illnesses will not be serious, and they soon recover.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to their education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.
- If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day, they took the test. The risk of passing the infection on to others from is much lower after 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature.
- Any staff who have a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home for 5 days after the day they took the test
- Children and young people who usually attend an education or childcare setting and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.
- All staff and pupils are advised to follow the 'Living safely with COVID-19 and other respiratory infections guidance

Holiday Activities and Food Programme

If your child is in receipt of benefit related free school meals (FSM) you can register your interest in the Holiday, Activities, and Food (HAF) programme. This is a funded programme which provides free activities with a healthy meal to eligible children and young people in education from reception to year 11 during the school holidays. Last year over 800 children and young people attended activities such as climbing, horse riding, circus skills, orienteering, arts and crafts as well as sensory based activities for children with additional needs. In order to take part in the HAF programme you will need a unique booking code which can be requested by registering online at: https://www.wokingham.gov.uk/HAF

Wokingham Borough Council will also be running a number of Community Events this Easter holiday, which will enable the whole family to attend together. There will be a variety of fun activities, including sports and an Easter trail, along with a hot meal. Once you have received your unique booking code, you will be sent further information on how to book for your chosen activities during the Easter holidays.

their say. Look out for more details on this next term. In the classroom, there are areas where children's progress has been affected due to the pandemic, especially in writing. This is a key focus for the school and the Governors will receive regular updates on progress at Committee and Board meetings.
