

Parking

There is no doubt that parking is an issue at the start and end of the school day; however, parents and carers must not park in the car park of Murray House or at West Oak. There were so many cars in the private car park of Murray House yesterday at the end of the school day and people were manoeuvring all over the place, with little care for safety; a staff member witnessed adults arguing in front of the children and becoming aggressive. You will see from these photographs, that parking is prohibited in some areas around the school and no-one has the right to park on private property. We will be monitoring the situation with support from Wokingham Borough Council.



Safeguarding

Everything that we do has the children at its heart. Their wellbeing, their safety, their achievements and their happiness underpins every decision that we make, and determines how we work. Often when safeguarding is talked about the assumption is that it is just child protection - when a child is suffering harm, or is in danger of suffering harm. However, safeguarding is much, much broader than this and considers a range of areas. Our staff are regularly trained in safeguarding and our curriculum provides the children with many age appropriate opportunities to learn about how to keep healthy and safe. They have already

Lost Property

We appreciate the frustration and stress caused when a child misplaces an item of uniform or their shoes or coat. If items are not labelled with name and class, it is impossible to reunite them with their rightful owner. Please do check over the weekend that all items brought to school are clearly labelled and that they do in fact belong to your child - we have already had reports of children arriving home in uniform belonging to someone else and the lost property store (the green container near the bike shed) is overflowing with items.

Pupil Premium Funding

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits your child may be eligible for free school meals and Pupil Premium funding:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999. 7) Universal Credit.
