On their swimming days, pupils should come to school dressed in uniform, including school shoes, and bring their kit (costume or trunks, towel and swimming hat) to change into at the pool. We ask that swimming trunks are close fitting and not long, baggy Bermuda style shorts and that girls wear a one-piece suit.

Please remember that earrings are not permitted during any sport sessions and must be removed AT HOME before attending school that day.

#### **Outdoor Games**

All classes have Games each Thursday. Pupils should come to school dressed in PE kit (navy or black shorts or tracksuit, plain white t-shirt). No football shirts or brightly coloured sports kit!

Games lessons take place every week in all but the most extreme weather and, therefore, we ask that pupils bring their school uniform, in case they have to change into dry clothes.

#### **Forest School**



We welcomed 4P into the woodland on Monday afternoon. The children shared their surprise and amazement at the age of some of our trees, the size and features that they observed on the newts in the pond and how much greener the woodland was since their last visit.

During our afternoon sessions, the children have been using their collaboration skills to make swings. Lots of determination and resilience was needed to complete this task and Mrs McBain and Mrs Gray were really proud of the work of all the children. We also tried some Nordic braiding for the first time. This crafting activity requires communication, collaboration, determination and



plenty of resilience! We had mixed results (it's really hard to not get in a tangle) but it's definitely something that the children are keen to have a go at again and we can't wait to see the results.

Tomatoes have been added to our allotment area this week, our potatoes have been covered over again to protect them from frost damage and create more space for the potatoes to grow, we are starting to see some red strawberries and all our other crops are growing well. With some much-needed rain forecast for

the weekend, we look forward to seeing how the allotments develop over the half term break.

Please remember to send your child to Forest School in **long trousers** as the nettles are out! Pupils will need to bring suitable clothing with them on that day e.g. track suit bottoms, hoodie, T shirt and trainers. Shorts and skirts are unsuitable for the woodland area.

### Free School Meals/Pupil Premium

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children. Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium: 1) Income Support.

- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
