Headteacher's Message

Dear St Paul's Families.

I am not sure that I can remember a week quite like this one! Just in the last few days, we have had a monitoring visit by the Oxford Diocesan Board of Education and a monitoring visit from our WBC School Improvement Officer. Yesterday, we held our first Open Event of the year, welcomed Governors to Governor Day and ran a tour for prospective parents......and if that was not action packed enough, we evacuated the building part way through the afternoon when the fire alarm went off! Understandably, the children and staff are more than ready for a well-deserved weekend but they should be immensely proud of the wealth of positive feedback we have received from those visiting St Paul's this week.

- Pupils said they feel safe in school, one stated: 'I don't notice the difference between school and home, this is my 2nd home - teachers feel like our 2nd parents'. They were very clear that everyone is treated equally, there is a huge diversity in the school but these differences are celebrated. Pupils didn't feel there is any real bullying in the school, they talk to the teachers and things are sorted out.' (OBDE Advisor)
- 'Adults and pupils display warm relationships and mutual respect leading to the very good learning attitudes and behaviours observed across the school.' (WBC School Improvement Officer)
- We all agreed that it was the best Governor's Day we had had. The children were a delight, engaging with us in the classroom, at lunch and in the playground. The staff were welcoming and very accommodating as we dipped in and out of their lessons. We, the Governors, are all well aware of the hard work that is behind what we observed yesterday, the clarity of values, excellent presentation of the curriculum especially in the new schemes in Geography, History, Science and Art. We were all very impressed with the overall behaviour of the children. When talking to parents who were visiting at the same time as us, they too were impressed with the school.' - 'Amazing school! I am so happy I had a chance to visit school today. Everyone was busy and happy in classrooms. Keep doing your amazing job!' (Parental feedback after Open Morning)
- Fantastic visit, lovely to see all facilities. Received all the information needed and looking forward to our son joining in September - fingers crossed! (Prospective Parent)

The House Captains have done a brilliant job of selling items to raise money for the British Legion Poppy Appeal. Not all of the children who wished to make a donation remembered to bring their money into school and as there are still some items remaining, these will be on sale on Monday and Tuesday.



Yesterday's evacuation was a sight to see, with all pupils and staff out of the building and at their assembly points in less than three minutes. The children were calm and sensible as they quietly moved to their muster points and the governors were impressed by the behaviour of the whole school. Luckily, it was an accidental activation at Walter and not a real emergency so we could quickly return inside to continue with afternoon lessons.

Safety of pupils and parents!

We have had a number of serious complaints from local residents this week and despite our appeals to avoid parking alongside West Oak Care Home, some parents are still choosing to ignore the fact that this is a private road for residents only. This morning, there were cars parked all down the road and there were even some parked in the residents' own spaces. There were also parents parked in the car park of Murray House, another area we have repeatedly asked parents to avoid using for parking.

Drop off this morning was not only chaotic but dangerous, with pupils and parents at risk of serious injury. As some parents of Walter and St Paul's chose to park on the double yellow lines, there were no passing places for other drivers which resulted in complete gridlock. Drivers then began sounding horns and revving engines despite not being able to move in any direction, frightening the children and intimidating pedestrians trying to get to school.

To make matters worse, vehicles parked alongside West Oak then began pushing their way into the line of stationary traffic. The situation continued to deteriorate as parents then began disembarking their children into the middle of the road in the path of oncoming traffic, instead of using the pedestrian crossing.

We work very hard to keep our pupils safe whilst maintaining a positive partnership with our local community. Sadly, the behaviour of a number of parents from both schools is putting children at serious risk and jeopardising the good will of local residents towards our schools. Despite the best efforts of Walter, Meadow and St Paul's, we have not been able to bring about any lasting improvement to this issue and have asked for assistance from Wokingham Borough Council and Thames Valley Police and requested that Murray Road be considered as a site for the installation of an AMPR camera.

Message from the Governors



There are 3 vacancies on the governing body of our school for Parent Governors. The governing body is made up of people from different groups including parents, teachers, local authority appointed members and foundation governors who are appointed by the

diocese. A term of office lasts for 4 years – you will be amazed at how quickly the time flies. Depending on interests and expertise each governor sits on at least one of the three committees: Learning & Teaching, Health & Safety and Finance & Personnel. Our current governors have introduced themselves on the governor page of the school web site.

What do governors do?

School governors:

- are responsible for the strategic management of the school;
- oversee its aims, values and ethos;
- promote high standards of educational attainment;
- monitor pupil progress and attainment;
- ensure compliance with the National Curriculum;
- manage the budget, including deciding the number of staff and pay;
- participate in the appointment of the Headteacher and Deputy Head;
- regulate school conduct and discipline.

The governors act as a team, but the amount of time that each is able to give to the role varies. The full governing body meets every half term and committees between 3 and 6 times a year. The governors support the school in practical ways throughout the year by joining in with events. Once a term they are invited in to spend a whole day in school observing how their discussions and decisions are being put into practice. The highlight of these days is always talking to the pupils in their classrooms, over lunch and in the playground.

What will I get out of being a governor?

You will get:

- the knowledge that you have played a significant part in improving children's education and supporting the staff;
- a chance for continuing professional development and to develop new skills, such as chairing meetings, asking questions, making suggestions and monitoring the budget;
- A chance to work as part of a dynamic team.

There is a legal process to follow in appointing governors but the clerk will be able to help you through this process and training for your future role will also be available. If you've already applied for the Household Support Fund you do not need to apply again.

- SHARE Wokingham offers fresh produce, like bread and vegetables, for those who need it. These are surplus stock from local supermarkets. More than 2,000 people use it each week and it has saved more than 1,000 tonnes in food waste since it was launched a few years ago. View the food map to see SHARE's 15 locations and find your nearest.
- Follow these top tips for households on how to lower your energy bills this winter. Or you can try:
 - o The council's new home energy advice service to see how to lower your bills
 - See if you're eligible <u>Great British Insulation Scheme</u> is offering free or cheaper insulation to reduce your home's energy bills
 - Check if your home is eligible for a Heat Pump Grant a part of the Boiler Upgrade Scheme up to £7,500 on offer towards the costs
- We're encouraging people to <u>register with power, water and gas suppliers</u> if they are potentially vulnerable this winter. These are known as priority services, which mean you get help faster if you are cut off or additional warnings if there are outages like loss of water pressure or power cuts

HAF

As a reminder, the HAF Programme offers funding for activities in the main school holidays of Easter, summer and Christmas for children and young people in school years from Reception to year 11 who are eligible to benefits related free school meals. There is also the option for professionals working with families, who are not eligible but would benefit from the programme, to make a referral depending on their family circumstances. You can find full details on our website: Holiday, activities, and food programme (wokingham.gov.uk) Please make any referrals as early as possible prior to school holidays in order for the application to be considered and processed in time.

In Wokingham, the entitlement for primary aged children is:

- X2 6 hour days per week for 1 week at Easter, 1 week at Christmas and x4 weeks in the summer. HAF does not operate in half term holidays.
- The HAF Team also run events across the Borough during school holidays for families to attend together. Along with our regular twice weekly SEND stay and play sessions and our newly launched SEND drop off sessions for children and young people aged 8-13 years.

Although children in years Reception to Year 2 ALL receive Universal free school meals, in order to identify those families who are eligible for the HAF Programme we would like you to encourage parents to apply for benefits related free school meals as early as possible.

All allocations for funding and vouchers for parents to be able to book funded activities will continue to be via the new Wonde (e-Vouchers) booking system. The e-Vouchers team will be in contact with you to confirm what you need to do in order for vouchers to be sent to your eligible families for use this Christmas. Vouchers will go live from the system on 6th November. Please ensure that the children who are eligible for free school meals are marked in your system so that the vouchers will be sent to them when they are activated by Wonde. Please note that the HAF team will manually load vouchers for any children who have an active referral to the programme. You will not need to upload any additional vouchers for children if your system

is linked to the booking system. Any children who do not receive benefits related free school meals should not be send any manual vouchers. If you or a family worker assess that the child/ren should be considered for a referral, please follow the referral process as above. If parents have any queries about receiving their vouchers, they can contact haf@wokingham.gov.uk in the first instance. If it is a technical issue which we are not able to resolve, we will refer them onto the Wonde (e-Vouchers) support team.

Pupil Premium Funding

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits your child may be eligible for free school meals and Pupil Premium funding:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
