## Safeguarding

If your child has a watch that is capable of recording voice or film, it must not be worn to school. Any devices that are brought in to school will be kept in the office and parents will be called to come and collect them.

#### Early Morning Clubs Drop-off

If dropping off for an early morning club, parents must wait in reception with their child until the coach arrives. School does not open until 8.30am, at which time staff are available to supervise the children until the start of school at 8.50am.

## Word of the Day

"I just wanted to email to say thank you for introducing word of the day. I have two children at your school and I have noticed how much they are using words that they have learnt from word of the day in their everyday chatting. Thank you so much for expanding their vocabularies.

My child is genuinely excited when he gets word of the day into his conversion. I don't know how this has been achieved but thank you!"

We believe the widening of your child's vocabulary knowledge is an integral part of their development as speakers, readers and writers. To this end, each class has a daily 'word of the day' session, exploring specific words relevant to their current Guided Reading text or to their written English work.

A word is either selected from the writing stimulus being used in English or chosen because it could be used effectively within a specific writing task. It is then explored in terms of its word class, meaning in context, spelling pattern and etymology before the children investigate related synonyms and antonyms.

Through the context of their English work, the children are given the challenge of writing a well-constructed sentence which demonstrates the meaning of that word. This task also provides the perfect opportunity to reinforce your children's understanding of the Grammar being taught, along with the related technical vocabulary.

Throughout the day, pupils can be seen raising their thumbs when they hear a word of the day being used by their peers and adults alike. They are keen to share when they have spotted the use of such a word in a written text and they are encouraged to do so – although I did have to curb the excitement of some when words of the day were spotted during last year's SATs Reading test!

Your support with this initiative is invaluable. Please remember to ask your children to share their words of the day, praise them for using them appropriately and try to use them yourselves. Keep ticking evidence of the words being used in your child's Reading Record and help them to earn house points – the more the merrier! If you are unsure as to what words your child has been studying, the 5 words from the previous week are included in the homework set each week - <u>https://www.stpauls.wokingham.sch.uk/website/homework\_2019-20/422208</u>


