Reading

Read aloud to an adult for 20 minutes at least 4 times every week. During your reading, make sure you have answered at least 3 questions from different sections of the <u>Reading Booklet for Parents</u>. Then, discuss how you feel about what you have read. Ask the adult to write a comment in your Reading Journal.

Spelling

Remember the first week is learning and the second week is consolidation. Explain what a suffix is to an adult. The suffixes that we are recapping are, -er, -ed and -ing. Discuss words that contain these suffixes and make a list of examples that you have found in your reading. Remember to take your list into school on Friday.
