Head Lice



Our school is supporting the Once a Week, Take a Peek campaign, which aims to encourage parents to work together to beat head lice. Head lice are a normal part of childhood –with as many as one in ten children experiencing head lice at any time. Although anyone can get head lice, they are particularly common amongst children of primary school age, who spend more time in close contact with their friends. So, you need to be vigilant and check your child's hair regularly, ideally once every week. The best-known symptom is itching, but not all children will

itch at first so don't rely on this. Leaving lice untreated can be a cause of distraction and irritation for children. The good news is that you can deal with head lice quickly and easily if you take the right action. See the Link below for advice on treatment.

Forgotten kit, lunches and other items.



Cost of Living Help Hub

Wokingham have pulled information, help and support together in one place, to help families who are struggling to pay for food, energy bills and other essential household items. There is also additional support available in the school holidays for families who have children eligible for Free School Meals. For more information, follow the link cost of living help hub

Families eligible for Free School Meals

If your child gets means-tested free school meals you are entitled to financial support. Wokingham Borough Council and First Days Children's Charity are working together to provide payments to help during school holidays. <u>Apply through First Days Children's Charity.</u>

You can get £15 per week, per eligible child, during school holidays. This applies for half terms, Christmas and Easter holidays. It will be back paid to October half-term if you've not already applied.

The amount you get in total depends on the number of children in your family who receive free school meals:

- One child £120
- Two children £210
- Three children £315
- Four children £420
- Five children £525
- Six children £630
