SAFEGUARDING - PLEASE READ

The reason we strongly advise against our pupils using social media and chat platforms aimed at 11+ years is because it is impossible to control what others share online. It has come to light that some of our older pupils have been exposed to highly inappropriate and deeply offensive content, including derogatory and discriminatory swearing and sexualised language in a number of group chats involving pupils of St Paul's and I would urge all parents to regularly check a child's devices to prevent them from being exposed to, or involved in, this type of behaviour. We take the safeguarding of our pupils very seriously, even for out of school incidents, such as these, including when pupils are in the care of parents, we will always act. Should you find your child has been a victim of online abuse, this should be reported immediately to CEOP https://www.ceop.police.uk/ceop-reporting/. We would also ask that you advise school so that we are able to provide the appropriate support.

Cost of Living Help Hub

Families eligible for Free School Meals

If your child gets means-tested free school meals you are entitled to financial support. Wokingham Borough Council and First Days Children's Charity are working together to provide payments to help during school holidays. <u>Apply through First Days</u> <u>Children's Charity</u>.

You can get £15 per week, per eligible child, during school holidays. This applies for half terms, Christmas and Easter holidays. It will be back paid to October half-term if you've not already applied.






