Bike Safety

BIKE SAFETY for kids

Use the Eyes, Ears and Mouth Test

EYES CHECK

Position the helmet ony our head. Look up and you should see the bottom rim of the helmet. The rim should be one to two finger-widths above the

MOUTH CHECK -

Open your mouth as wide as you can. Do you feel the helmet hug your head? If not, tighten those straps and make sure the buckle is flat against your skin.



HELMETS Can reduce the risk of severe brain injuries by 88%

EARS CHECK

Make sure the straps of the helmet form a "V" under your ears when buckled. The strap should be snug but comfortable.

Important Tips

KEEP AN EYE OUT

Actively supervise children yuntil you're comfortable that they are responsible to ride on their own.

IT CAN BE HARD

for kist to judge speed and distance of cars until age 10. Limit riding to sidewalks and be careful for vehicles in driveways, parks or bike paths.



CHILDREN SHOULD BE ABLE

to demonstrate riding competence and knowledge of the rules of the road before cycling with traffic.

TEACH GOOD BEHAVIOR

Kids learn from watching you, so it's extra important for parents to model proper behavior. Wear a helmet, even if you didn't when you were a kid.

Please can we remind all parents and pupils that if your child is riding a bike to school they **need** to ensure that they are:

- 1. Wearing a helmet at all times.
- 2. Riding safely on the roads.
- 3. Using hand signals.
- 4. Being cautious of cars & other vehicles.

Use Appropriate Helmets for Different Activities
