

Headteacher's Message

Dear St Paul's Families,



It was lovely to welcome the children and staff back this morning. The school was a sea of red, with no two children dressed exactly the same. This tied in beautifully with assembly, where we celebrated our unique differences. We talked together about how sometimes in society people do not always get along, forgetting that it is our differences that make us special. We also discussed discrimination and how sometimes, groups or individuals are treated unfairly because of their beliefs, race, gender, disability or sexual orientation. The highlight was hearing the children's ideas as to how we can all play a part in making sure that our playground

and school are a happy place for everyone, and about the ways in which we can value one another.

Tuesday's evacuation was very impressive. All we knew was that it was a real activation. Classes left the building swiftly and quietly, assembling on the playground in under two and a half minutes. It was a while before the fire brigade gave the all clear but throughout the time outside, the children's behaviour was exemplary. It was a cold and drizzly afternoon and some children had come straight from PE. Our kind hearted staff team did a 'Walter Raleigh', taking off cardigans and jackets and laying them on the playground so children who were barefoot had something warm, clean and dry to stand on. The Fire Service received a resounding cheer as they left. The problem had been a faulty light at Walter, which was quickly made safe.

Despite a heartfelt ParentMail message last week, a small number of parents still insist on parking in the road opposite the Murray Road gates. This causes a huge amount of ill feeling and is the source of numerous complaints! The road is private and parking is for residents only. They are within their rights to ask drivers to park elsewhere and should not be subject to rudeness or abuse from anyone, including members of our school community. I would strongly urge parents to park elsewhere, as this would be the same level of care and consideration that you would hope to see from visitors to the area in which you live.

It is a very warm welcome to our newest pupil, Kabutey, who recently joined 3K and a fond farewell to Vrinda who is leaving 3K to start at a new school. We wish her and her family every happiness in their new home and lots of luck for the future.



We wish Mr Walsh, our Site Controller, a speedy recovery. He has been rather unwell this week and has had to take some time away from school. We are looking forward to welcoming him back once he is back to fighting fit and in the meantime, would like to thank Mr Walker, our Site Assistant, for doing a brilliant job of taking on additional duties.

Finally, our hearts go out to the family of Sue Page who recently passed away. Sue was a member of our team of Learning Mentors for over 30 years and a well-loved member of staff. Her association with the school stretched back even further, as both of her boys were also pupils here. Sue worked with over a thousand children, all of whom benefitted from her 'magic touch' – the ability to persuade even the most reluctant of learners to attempt a task when no one else could. In her role as a lunchtime controller, she was also a firm favourite, going the extra mile to help children who had got themselves into difficulty on the playground. She was an exceptionally kind hearted and caring person who will be very much missed by everyone lucky enough to know her or work alongside her. Our thoughts and prayers are with her family at this very difficult time

Cost of Living Help Hub

Wokingham have pulled information, help and support together in one place, to help families who are struggling to pay for food, energy bills and other essential household items. There is also additional support available in the school holidays for families who have children eligible for Free School Meals. For more information, follow the link cost of living help hub

Families eligible for Free School Meals

If your child gets means-tested free school meals you are entitled to financial support. Wokingham Borough Council and First Days Children's Charity are working together to provide payments to help during school holidays. <u>Apply through First Days Children's Charity.</u>

You can get £15 per week, per eligible child, during school holidays. This applies for half terms, Christmas and Easter holidays. It will be back paid to October half-term if you've not already applied.

The amount you get in total depends on the number of children in your family who receive free school meals:

- One child £120
- Two children £210
- Three children £315
- Four children £420
- Five children £525
- Six children £630

Emotional Wellbeing Strategy WBC

Wokingham are currently in the early stages of developing a new Emotional Wellbeing Strategy for children and young people with mild to moderate emotional wellbeing needs.
