Message from the Governors

The School Governors would like to mark the end of this remarkable and unprecedented School Year by thanking all of the St Paul's family for their amazing commitment and understanding and willingness and adaptability and kindness over these last 4 months.

Thank you to pupils for everything you have had to give up and miss out on and for the way you've kept trying to do your best even when it felt really hard.

Thank you to parents and carers for supporting your children so well and for working so hard to balance everything and to maintain their emotional wellbeing alongside their learning.

Thank you to all of the School staff- we couldn't be prouder of the way in which you have, in different ways, put the needs of the pupils first even under intense pressure.

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Should you have any concerns please speak to Mrs. J M Taylor, Designated Child Protection Officer.

And thank you, above all, to Mrs Taylor, Ms Edwards and the team who have worked tirelessly to obey the Government's ever-changing guidance, liaise with staff, draw up risk assessment after risk assessment, reimagine what the School day and landscape will have to look like and keep putting the children first.

This Note comes for three reasons. The first is to thank the whole of the School family for pulling together and for working together. The second is to explain a little of what the School has been learning and developing and dealing with over the last months. Every School has had to work out how the Government's changing instructions can be applied to their context and situation- what is the building like, how many staff are available, how many children can come in at any one time, what tech systems are in place etc. The Governors have been kept fully informed at every step and have been fully supportive of the decisions made. There has been a remarkable amount of planning and decision-making happening, predicated on the safety and learning of our students and staff.

Which is to say that different schools locally have each been applying the same instructions for their own context. Sometimes they have been able to go further than the advice of the Government requires because of having spare rooms or a better tech system or less of a commitment to equality of opportunity to learn. The Governors are hugely proud of the energy, vision and leadership shown by the School.

The third is to ask our parents or pupils for any comments or feedback they would like to offer to the Governing Body as we assess what has gone well and what we can focus more on in the future. A number of parents have been in touch with the School already, to offer both thanks and questions, and that is excellent and as it should be. The system works in that sense- but we would like to get an overview of how things have been and whether there are experiences and ideas we can capture now as we think about the new school year.

What has been the biggest surprise of the last four months? How has your child's learning style changed? How has their attitude to learning changed? What will they be carrying with them into the classroom in September that will be a firm foundation for the year? What have they not missed about School that you thought they would? What has been missing from their learning? And what are you most grateful to the School for which we can keep on doing in the new year?

Things have changed a lot over the last few months and we know that if, in the future, we face lockdown or have to close a bubble we now have the technology, infrastructure and expertise to set and respond to work remotely, provide virtual access to classmates and teachers and provide lessons taught by our own staff. We are still keen to capture any other thoughts and experiences which we can then bear in mind for the year to come. Thank you for that- thank you for everything you have been doing and will do over the summer. Have a wonderful summer, whatever you are doing. It will be amazing to see you again in September.
