We have included her story in this week's newsletter so that everyone has a chance to enjoy Alba's writing.

"All throughout England, at every school you happen to come across you will find a lollipop lady, so named because of the long sticks they hold. They are there to tell children when it is safe to cross. They wait for a gap in the early morning traffic and hold up their sticks to signal cars to stop and allow the multiple school children to cross so they can begin their day of fun and learning.
