# **Special Assemblies**

# Message from Caterlink Regarding Allergies/Cultural/Lifestyle Dietary Requirements

For cultural/lifestyle dietary requirements, it is not the responsibility of the Caterlink kitchen staff to check whether or not a child is eating something which is prohibited to them. Parents must ensure that a child is aware of what they can and cannot eat before ordering a school meal. A copy of the menu can be found on the website here. These are guidelines that the Caterlink staff working in our kitchen must adhere to.

If you have informed Caterlink that your child has a food allergy that the kitchen staff should be aware of, a Caterlink Allergy & Intolerance Form must be completed, accompanied by a referral letter from a medical professional (GP/consultant/dietician). This documentation can be handed in to the school office staff who will pass it on to the kitchen. It is also helpful for the kitchen staff to be able to display a photo of your child with the allergen information near the servery. Well done to all our runners especially those of you who were running for St. Paul's for the first time.






## **Talent Spotlight**

#### Amelie Bowles - Year 6



Amelie is an Artistic Gymnast. She works incredibly hard, training for 20 hours a week at her club, Bulmershe. In addition, she trains for 4 weekends as part of the Southern Region Team and last year was selected for the GB Performance Pathway Squad 2018, sitting just under the home nation team. This involved 3 training residentials at Lilleshall National Sports Centre, Shropshire - home of GB gymnastics - where she was coached by GB coaches alongside Amy Tinkler.

Amelie has had a great competition year.

In March she won Gold at the Southern Region Compulsory Grade 3 Championships, qualifying for National Finals to compete individually against the top 40 gymnasts in GB and as a member of the Southern Region team. These took place in May. She won Gold on vault and finished 7th overall, helping Team South to Gold!

She did well at the Berkshire County Championships in July, winning Vault and gaining Silver on Bars, Beam and Floor, giving her a Silver overall.

In October she competed in the Southern Region Level 3 Championships, again qualifying for National Finals individually and as a member of Team South. The competition in November saw her become British Vault Champion and across both National Finals in 2018 placed 11th in Great Britain in the all-around competition. She's hoping it will be enough to retain her place in the GB Performance Pathway Squad for 2019. Team South also won Silver in the team competition.

Congratulations Amelie on your achievements so far and we look forward to following your progress in the year to come!
